

Week in Review

USDA March US acreage report came out opposite what most traders were looking for. In the report USDA estimated corn plantings were more than the trade expected, but down from a year ago. Soybean plantings were estimated at less than expected, but up from a year ago. USDA estimated all planted crop acres at 324.8 million down 2 million from last year. Most of the drop in total planted acres versus last year was in ND, SD, NE, KS, OK and TX. This is probably a sign that some decisions are still to be made in these states on what crop to plant this year. The March report gives farmers a benchmark to see what others are thinking of planting in 2015. It also gives them the chance to change their minds and make planting adjustments to take advantage of market opportunities. Given the potential of a drier or perhaps drought year some farmers might hedge against this by planting sunflowers. With the March reports factored into the market the attention shifts to the South American harvest and to spring weather in the Midwest ahead of planting.

2014 U.S. SUNFLOWER ACREAGE AND PRODUCTION

United States sunflower production totaled just over 2.2 billion pounds in 2014, up about 9% from the 2013 crop's size. That's according to the 2014 U.S. Sunflower Crop Quality Report, compiled annually by the National Sunflower Association, in cooperation with the USDA Foreign Agricultural Service. The report also says the U.S. average yield per acre at 1,469 pounds - was 6.5% higher than 2013's 1,380-pound average. Planted area, at 1.56 million acres, was just slightly below that of 2013. Area harvested in 2014, however, increased by 3% from the prior year, at 1.51 million acres. 2014 SEED QUALITY

The NSA's annual U.S. Sunflower Crop Quality Report for 2014 also takes a look at seed quality. The report indicated an average oil content of 41.5% for the surveyed oil-type samples and average test weight of 30.1 lbs. Those numbers compared with 41.9% and 30.1 lbs, respectively, for the 2013 crop year samples. On the non-oil side, the 2014 samples' average test weight was 21.0 lbs. Test weight the previous year averaged 22.0 lbs; in 2012, 22.4 lbs. Of the 2014 non-oil samples, 79.7% of the seeds were over 20/64 in size. That number compares with 85.4% in 2013 and 84.1% in the 2012 samples.

USDA PLANTING INTENTIONS REPORT SHOWS INCREASE IN **SUNFLOWER ACRES**

According to the USDA Planting Intentions Report sunflower growers intend to plant a total of 1.79 million acres in 2015, up 14 percent from last year. Area intended for oil type varieties, at 1.49 million acres, is up 27 percent from 2014. The area intended for non-oil varieties, estimated at 301,000 acres, is down 23 percent from last year. The report reflects trade thoughts that oil type acres would show an increase and non-oil would have a decrease in acres from 2014. SUNFLOWER STOCKS DOWN

USDA also reported sunflower stocks in all positions as of March 1, 2015. Seed stocks totaled 696 million pounds, down 14 percent from March 1, 2014. All stocks stored on farms totaled 257 million pounds and offfarm stocks totaled 439 million pounds. Stocks of oil type sunflower seed are 503 million pounds; of this total, 195 million pounds are on-farm stocks and 308 million pounds are offfarm stocks. Non-oil sunflower stocks totaled 193 million pounds, with 61.4 million pounds stored on the farm and 131 million pounds stored off the farm.
