

### **Week in Review**

#### Markets

NOAA released their longer term forecasts last week. They look for the drought situation to grow worse in the Upper Midwest and project it to persist beyond the planting season. Small grain planting in the Northern Plains is off to good start in comparison to last year's rain delayed planting season. However if dry conditions persist in the Northern Plains as forecast it will affect crop production as there is very little soil moisture to carry the crop through the growing season. Traders continue to see US export sales winding down seasonally as supplies from South America enter the world market. A huge soybean crop is hitting the market as Argentina and Brazil are both harvesting big crops. Sunflower prices had a mixed week with the market taking back some of the past two weeks rally. The birdfood market continues to trade at a premium to crush plant prices. Crop budgets are still showing sunflowers among the topearners in 2015. New crop sunflower prices are very competitive with other crops as the industry tries to secure 2015 production after 2014's small crop and the potential of very tight ending seed stocks by the end of September.

#### **PLANTER CONSIDERATIONS**

As sunflower planting approaches for the major production region, it's important to take a close look at planter condition and settings. Achieving the perfect plant stand is one of the most critical challenges for growers each year. The NSA website offers a series of tutorial videos featuring John Smith, Agricultural Engineer with the University of Nebraska at Scottsbluff. Smith conducted seed placement tests on oil sunflower and large seeded confections using a variety of metering and planter types. #### SUNFLOWER OIL EXPORTS INCREASE

Just five months into the 2014-15 marketing year, Japan is only 338 metric tons (MT) behind last year's sunflower oil imports for the entire marketing year. From October 2014 to February 2015, Japan has imported 2,137 MT of sunflower oil, compared to just 295 MT a year ago. For the entire 2014-15 marketing year, 2,575 MT of sunflower oil was exported to Japan. Exports to Canada are also up, from 6,526 MT a year ago to 8,297 MT so far this year. Overall, sunflower oil exports have increased, from 10,561 MT from October 2013 to February 2014 to 12,587 MT from October 2014 to February 2015.

# EXPORTS OF IN-SHELL SUNFLOWER AND KERNEL INCREASE

Exports of both in-shell sunflower and sunflower kernel continue to increase. From October 2014 to February 2015, kernel exports stand at 5,495 metric tons (MT). That compares to 4,489 MT during the same time frame a year ago. Spain remains the top importer of sunflower kernel. From October 2014 to February 2015, 1,528 MT of sunflower kernel was exported to Spain, compared to 1,246 MT a year ago. In-shell exports increased from 22,718 MT from October 2013 to February 2014 to 23,439 MT from October 2014 to February 2015. So far this marketing year, exports to Turkey have increased from 1,928 MT last year to 2,925 MT.
